

STAND ALONE APPLICATIONS (VARYING DEADLINES):

PENNSYLVANIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SCHOLARSHIP: For graduating seniors and legal residents of PA, with a minimum 3.0 GPA, planning to attend any four year college in PA, and demonstrating leadership and community service (Two recipients/ Amount varies)

PENNHOSA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for affiliated, paid HOSA chapter members by January 1 with financial need (Multiple recipients/Amount varies)

LEADER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: For legal resident of Cumberland, Dauphin, Lancaster, or York county who has been accepted into HACC Harrisburg Campus LPN program as a full-time student to study in the LPN Program (Number of recipients varies/ up to \$5,000)

ELIGIBILITY FOR ALL OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS BELOW WILL BE FILTERED BY COMPLETING THE TFEC UNIVERSAL APPLICATION (DEADLINE IS MARCH 15):

MELVIN J. AND ALICE GAYLE REEDER SCHOLARSHIP: For Northern (York) High School graduating seniors with strong citizenship, a strong work ethic and service to the community. (1 winner up to \$1500)

CONRAD SIEGEL "NUMBERS MATTER" COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for graduating high school seniors pursuing a math, actuarial science, business math, or finance major at a four-year college/ university. They must be a resident of Dauphin, Cumberland, Perry, Lancaster, Lebanon, or York County, be a member of an underserved, minority population of the community and have financial need. (Multiple winners / up to \$5,000 each)

LOUISE A. DIXON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: For graduating seniors from Cedar Cliff High School or Northern (York) High School who plans to attend a post-secondary education, has a minimum GPA of 2.5 and has evidence of volunteerism and/or extracurricular activities. (1 award/ up to \$2500)

YORK ROTARY CHARITABLE ENDOWMENT FUND: For graduating seniors from York County high schools-preference given to students who are residents of the City of York. (10 funds-see below)

James & Carrie Bush— for high academic achievement (\$1100/year x 4 years)

Edwin P. Mangold-for high academic achievement (\$1250/year x 4 years)

Sanford M. Kranich— for a student who will attend a 2 or 4-year institution. (\$2000)

Charles. W. Diehl Jr.-for a student attending a 4 year , degree granting institution majoring in Engineering, preference given to William Penn High School grads. (\$1100)

John T. & Paige S. Smith— high academic achievement, majoring in Agriculture and participation in Agricultural activities. (\$3000)

Arlington Kahley "Rising Musician"- high academic achievement and participation in music. (\$1000)

Donna E. Hayes Equine— for a student in their Junior or Senior year of college or grad school majoring in the Equine field. Students must have participation and accomplishments in equine activities. (\$3200)

"Service Above Self" -Students in their Junior year of college who demonstrate high academic achievement, accomplishments and a high level of community service. (2-year/ \$2500/year)

York Rotary Non-Traditional Scholarship- for students who did not go to college immediately following high school (\$3000)

SAM MIZRAHI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: For graduating seniors from Northern (York) High School who plan to pursue a post-secondary education, has a minimum GPA of 2.5, shows leadership, character and has done community service. (Multiple winners/up to \$1000)

DRANE AND STEELE MUSIC FUND: For students from Adams, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Montour, Northumberland, Perry, Snyder, and York Counties, studying classical music composition, teaching, and performance (Multiple recipients/Up to \$5,000)

ROYER FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: The Royer family have established this fund to help their employees, their children or grandchildren gain additional education to help them succeed in life. This scholarship is available for trade, 2 or 4-year post high school continued education for full or part-time students. (Up to 4 awards/ \$1000-\$2500)

BIG 33 ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for students in PA planning to attend a technical school or accredited college or university following high school graduation. (Multiple winners/ up to \$2,000 each)

MCINROY-SHEFFER PEOPLE TRUST FUND: for graduating seniors studying elementary education, culinary arts, communications, fundamental business operations, hands-on trades, nursing, management, or e-business (Multiple recipients/Up to \$2,000)

SKYLER JAMES WENGER SCHOLARSHIP: for a graduating senior from Cedar Cliff or Red Land High Schools who plans to pursue a post-secondary degree and comes from a single parent household. (amount varies/1 winner from each high school)

BRUCE MANGIONE FUND: for students who attend school within the city of Harrisburg and children of the employees of NRG Energy (Harrisburg office) or Harrisburg Hilton and Towers (Two recipients/Up to \$1,500)

GROVE FAMILY FUND #2 – HACC: for students attending Harrisburg Area Community College as a full-time or part time student. Minimum GPA of 2.0 or higher (Two recipients/Amount varies)

EASH-POTTER SCHOLARSHIP FUND: the scholarship will support students committed to improving the campus and community climate for LGBTQ people (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies)

JUDITH A. INGRAM MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: For seniors in the West Shore School District who have a GPA of at least 2.5 and plan to major in Elementary Education.

THAD G. GAYMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FUND: For seniors from Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, Perry and Northern York Counties who plan on studying Automotive Technology and attending a 2- or 4-year college, university, or trade school (one award /amount varies)

BEISTLE COMPANY SCHOLARSHIP FUND: for students who are legal dependents of full time employees of the Beistle Company; second preference may be given to students graduating from Shippensburg High School; third preference may be given to students graduating from high schools within a 30 mile radius of Shippensburg (Number of recipients varies/Up to \$1,000 per year for up to four years)

GARY D. RADINE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM: for dependent children of a Delta Dental employee attending a two- or four-year accredited college as a full-time student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 and participating in extracurricular activities, work experience, and community service (Two recipients/\$5,000)

KENNETH G. ROBINSON, APR MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: for PA undergraduate students who are civic-minded and require tuition assistance to continue their education in the Communication and Public Relations fields. (\$1000)

NICK PANTALONE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP: For students graduating from high schools located in the following counties: Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Lebanon, Perry and Northern York County (Dillsburg Area) . Students must have at least a 3.0 GPA. 1 award up to \$2500

DR. GEORGE H. AND MRS. HETTIE S. LOVE “LOVE OF LEARNING” SCHOLARSHIP FUND: An eligible student would have financial need and will be entering the education field. The scholarship is designed to support Black students and students of color entering the education profession.

WALTERS SERVICES, INC. FABE & BEVERLY WALTERS SCHOLARSHIP FUND: Applicants must be children of employees under the age of 26, or must be a seasonal employee under the age of 26, with plans to attend college, university, or a trade school as a full-time or part-time student. (Number of recipients varies/Amount varies).

LIPPERT –SIZEMORE SCHOLARSHIP FUND: The PFLAG-Greater Harrisburg developed this scholarship to recognize outstanding persons from Central PA for their involvement with the LGBTQ+ community. Must have a GPA of 2.7+ (1 award/\$1000-\$1500).

UNIVERSITY CENTER OF HARRISBURG SCHOLARSHIP FUND: For graduating high school seniors with a 2.0+ GPA or greater. (up to \$2500)

MATCHING AWARD OPPORTUNITIES

AES/PHEAA's PATH Program: Scholarship recipients are eligible to have their awards matched on a dollar-for-dollar basis by AES/PHEAA's *PATH ("Partnerships for Access to Higher Education") Program*. PHEAA may grant matching funds to scholarship recipients who are enrolled in an approved Pennsylvania college or career school as an undergraduate student on at least a half-time basis, who are a Pennsylvania state grant recipient and who demonstrate financial need. Students must also be a resident of Pennsylvania, not in default on any educational loans, maintain academic progress, and not be considered an incarcerated student. The match provides last-dollar support for tuition and fees. *Scholarship funds used for reimbursement of textbook purchases are not eligible for a PATH Program match.* The scholarship recipient's information is submitted to PHEAA by TFEC staff.
